We can reconstruct local communities through community-based activities related to traditional cultures. We can promote participation in regional activities by Work-Style Reforms.



Conclusions

What we learn from the result of interviews in Taiwan is...

- 1. Not a few Taiwanesepeople think it's important to mingle with neighbors.
- 2. The local activities, such as cooking traditional foods or performing arts, would strengthen a bond among different generations in local communities
- 3. The factor Taiwanese people complain about most is the lack of "communication".

The "communication" is the easiest way of Work-Style-Reform because it doesn't need money nor more people!

These results tell us that the local activities would bond people regardless of generation in the local communitie

Our Brand New Action Plan: Connecting people through the SNS and makinga virtual community not only to boost the Rugby World Cup, but also to provide connections for interactions to make our prefecture more lively and sustainable.
