



Disadvantages


- It may cost a lot to make the other assignments like





Research Background

- According to the results of PISA from year 2003 to 2012, there is no other country with the same scale of population, that is in a relatively higher position than Japan. (NIEPR 2015)
- This indicates that in Japan "everyone has been educated equally" and "everyone has been educated at the same level."
- However, there is a wide variation in students' academic performance.
- Those in the higher rank in the academic performance are basically from such upper income group that they can afford higher education opportunity out of schools.
- Education level of each student keeps being reproduced by parents' financial status, so that there will be a risk of students' education gap getting wider.(Kariya 2012, Oxford University)
