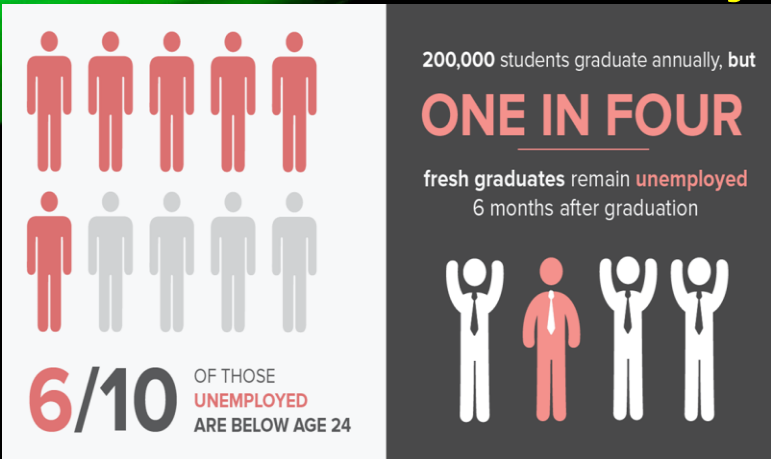


Unemployment in Malaysia is around **3%**.

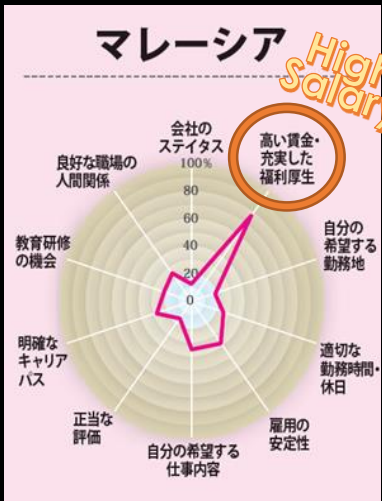

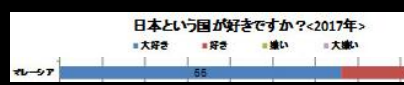

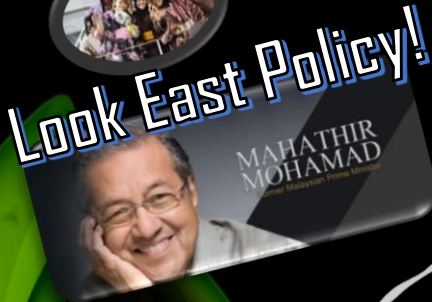
